CVC stands for Consonant Vowel Consonant, so a CVC word is a three letter word that follows this pattern. The word 'cat' is a great example of a CVC word. When you spell the word cat, first comes a consonant (c), then a short vowel (a), then another consonant (t). With CVC words, the focus is solely on decoding letter sounds. And CVC words are perfect words for early readers because they can be decoded very easily. That's why CVC words are often used to teach closed syllables, too! Why are CVC words important? CVC words are essential because they allow children to move from phonemic awareness (the first building block of reading) on to phonics (the second building block of reading). Research shows that children benefit from having ample opportunities to use their decoding skills on simple words as they learn to read. As soon as children know just a few letters and vowels, reading CVC words should begin. This typically happens within the first few months of kindergarten, but it should be practiced throughout kindergarten and the beginning of first grade. Children begin to understand that letters are not isolated sounds, but instead are put together to build words. There is nothing like watching a child begin to practice this skill and find such satisfaction in their achievement as they make sense of letters and sounds and decode words on their own! Children practice blending three letter sounds together in a simple way, without having to remember digraphs or recall irregular sight words. As children read CVC words, it helps solidify their recall for consonant and short vowel sounds. We put together a list of CVC words with pictures for practice and dictating words to students, plus a CVC matching game. Together, these worksheets help children learn and practice CVC words. Teachers can use this page for dictation! CVC Words and Pictures Matching (7 pages) The first five printable worksheets are separated by short vowel sound. This way, once you introduce a particular vowel to your child, you can use that worksheet to firm up the vowel sound and practice the skill of blending. Examples: /i/ cvc words: cat, fan, ham, sad./e/ cvc words: jet, ten, pen, fed./u/ cvc words: bin, sit, wig, pit./o/ cvc words: mom, cop, hog, bot./u/ cvc words: cup, bun, bug, cut. Just a heads up, /e/ and /i/ are the usually the most difficult for kids to hear, so you may want to spend some extra time on these sounds. You may want to use word-picture association cards or keywords for these tricky sounds (a - apple, e - elephant, i - igloo, o - octopus, u - umbrella.) Once all short vowels have been introduced, use the 2 Mixed Vowel Worksheets so students can practice differentiating between short vowel sounds in CVC words. I love it when kids finally learn the sounds of the letters and can start putting those sounds together to read words! It's exciting for kids as well. I am teaching my fourth child to read now. It's a fun and exciting time in a child's life. I think it is really important to teach reading in a gentle way so kids can find a love of reading in the process. It's easy to lose your patience in the process of teaching a child to read. But we need to remember that it is new and difficult and does not yet come naturally to them. Since it can sometimes be hard to think of a variety of words to use in teaching your young readers, I put together a printable CVC word list for all of you! What Are CVC Words? CVC stands for the Consonant Vowel Consonant sound in a word. They are three letter words that are spelled with a consonant a vowel and a consonant, in that order. They are all simple words that are perfect for teaching and practicing reading. These are the words you'll find in the easy reader books along with a few simple sight words. Teach Reading With CVC Words When teaching kids to read, we begin with the letters and sounds. When teaching phonics skills, we have a set of flashcards with the letters and all of their sounds on the back. I review them with my daughter a couple of times a week. It's important for kids to learn all of the letter sounds. However, the short vowel sounds are the first ones that kids learn, and CVC words are all short vowel words making it easy for kids to read them. CVC words are easy to build with letter tiles or letter flashcards. You can really do a lot of fun activities with them when teaching kids to read. See my post on 100 FUN Spelling Activities. Once kids can read some CVC words word building mats are another fun and interactive way to help your kids learn new words. This free printable CVC word building mat is a great phonics activity for kids who know their letters and sounds and are ready to begin blending words. CVC Word Building Mat With this freebie, you can teach your kids to recall the names of objects and learn to read words with short vowel sounds. The CVC Word Building Mat has five main sections: Place it. In this section kids can place one of the CVC prompt cards that are provided in the free printable. Alternatively, if you have small toys that relate to CVC words a real object could be placed in this section instead. Tap it. This section is designed to help kids orally segment and break apart the sounds in the word. Isolating these sounds will help them spell the word in the next section. Build it. Use this section to build the word with letter manipulatives. We're using magnetic letters here, but you could also use letter tiles, letter rocks or any small letter manipulative you have on hand. Draw it. Here kids can do a quick sketch of the object. This helps reinforce the visual connection between the object and its spelling. It also adds in fine motor practice. Be sure to laminate the page or use a protector of some kind. Write it. Finally kids can put it altogether and write the word on their own for additional fine motor practice. We've put together a short video to help you get started playing and learning! MATERIALS AND SETUP You won't need much to set up this quick learning activity. Start with the free printable CVC Word Building Mat (available for download below). Add in either the word prompt cards or some small toys that relate to CVC words. To allow for differentiation we've included word prompt cards with and without word cues. Select the format you want to use with each group of students. Cover your CVC Word Building Mat with a dry erase pocket (as pictured), a sheet protector or laminate it. Gather letter manipulatives and a dry erase marker, and you're set! HOW TO PLAY For each of the prompt cards your kids will: Place the card in the top left box Tap each dot to segment the sounds of the word Build the word using a letter manipulative (we use magnetic letters) Draw a picture of the object Write the word Once you've finished, erase the card and repeat with a new prompt card. For extra writing practice, have your kids record the words they've built on a separate sheet of paper. This will show them how many words they worked on and serve as a work sample, too.
